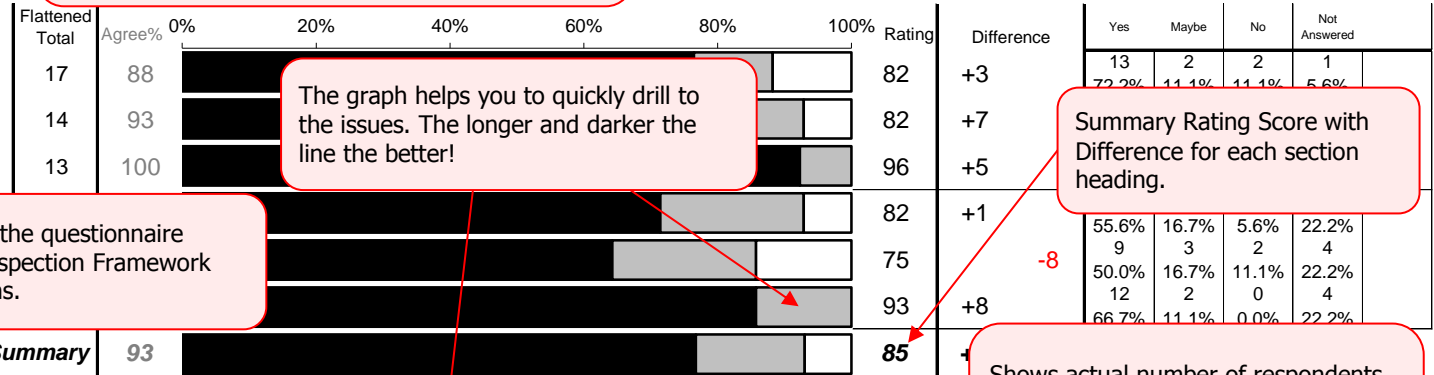

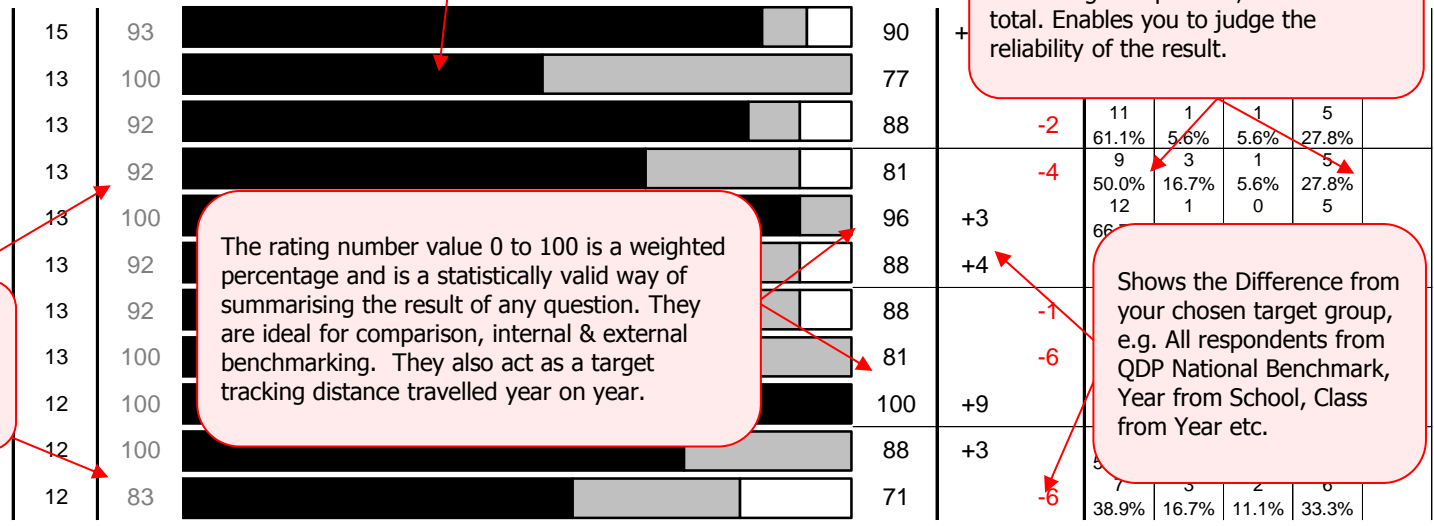
The graph helps you to quickly drill to the issues. The longer and darker the line the better!
